Year 3 Autumn Term 2024



Welcome to the Autumn Term! We have lots of new topics.

Have a look at the different topics we will be studying!

Please remember to read every day, it is incredibly important!

Our Art and DT topic in Autumn 1 is 'We are painters'. We will be looking at primary, secondary and tertiary colours; the colour wheel and how to create tones and mood. Our artist focus is Paul Klee.



In Autumn 2, we will be learning all about collage – shapes and patters.

This term in Maths we will be looking at number and place value of 3-digit numbers. We will be learning how to add and subtract numbers with up to 3-digit numbers using the column method. By the end of the term, children will learn multiplication and division of 2, 4 and 8 time tables and their relationship.

In Autumn 1 our topic is 'Meet the Flintstones! Changes from Stone Age to Iron Age'. We will be learning about Prehistoric Britain.



In Autumn 2, our Geography topic is 'Pollution Solution' where we will be learning about how we can help biodiversity.

Our Science topic in Autumn 1 is 'Rocks.' We will compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties. We will describe in simple terms how fossils are formed and recognise that soils are made from rock and organic matter. In Autumn 2, we will be learning about 'Animal including humans'.

Our topics for RE this term are:

'The Christian Family' and
'Mary, Mother of God'. In
other faiths, we will be
learning about Jewish Passover
and what it means to be
Christian, Muslim or Hindu in
Britain today.
