Year 1 had a great trip on Thursday too. They went to a local enclosed park on Percival Street.




Football Team to Arsenal

The Wednesday Word

This week's Gospel: Luke10:25-37 is also known as the Parable of the Good Samaritan. It tells the story of a man traveling from Jerusalem to Jericho who is robbed, beaten, and left for dead. A priest and a Levite, both religious figures, pass by without helping. A Samaritan, however, shows compassion, tending to the man's wounds and taking him to an inn, paying for his care. Jesus uses this parable to illustrate that a "neighbour" is anyone in need and that true love extends to all, even those considered enemies.
