How Can My Parent Help Me?

Talk: Encourage your child to listen to what others have to say without interrupting, and to talk about their interests.

Reading: Your child's reading book (Rhino/Bug Club Reader) and the library book will be sent out on Fridays. We kindly ask from you to bring the books back on Thursdays, so we can give you a new book on Friday. This will start in the second half of Autumn term. Please read to your child every night before bed so they become independent learners.

Reading is very important at this stage of their cognitive development, and it boosts language skills, memory, attention and critical thinking. It is also fostering social-emotional skills like empathy and communication. Teach your children to look after their books and to build love for reading. We can only give you a new book, once you return your old one on Thursday. If you lose or break the book, we will have to charge you for it, so we can buy new books.

Home Learning: Summaries and photos will be available on our Google classroom.

Sleep: Encourage good practices regarding exercise, hygiene and sleep, which can contribute to good health.




