All homework is set on the Google Classroom and it is to be completed in our blue homework books.

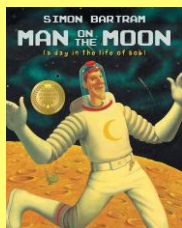
Reading books are changed every **Monday** and **Thursday**. Please ensure you sign your child's reading record so that their book can be changed.

Have a look at the different topics we will be studying!

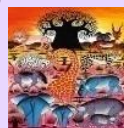
Please remember to read with your child every day, it is incredibly important!

In Maths this term we will be focusing on the composition of numbers up to 100, comparing numbers, ordering numbers, and adding and subtracting using their number bonds to 10. Year 2 will practise counting forwards and backwards to 100 and begin learning their 2, 5, 10 timetables.



In Autumn 1, our History topic is 'Intrepid Explorers!' We will be learning all about the explorers Matthew Henson and Tenzing Norgay.

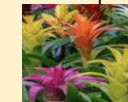


In Autumn 2, our Geography topic is called 'Home and Away.' We will be learning about countries in the UK, continents, and major cities of the world.
